

KOL: THE VOICE OF TBY

There is a traditional Jewish folktale that tells of a rabbi who needed a new suit and went to a tailor to have one made. The tailor promised it would be ready in a week, but when the rabbi returned to pick it up, it was not yet finished. "Three more days," said the tailor. Somewhat perturbed, but with no choice, the rabbi left the shop and returned at the newly arranged day. Now the suit was indeed ready,



and it fit perfectly, with not so much as a single stitch out of place. Impressed by the work, but still annoyed about the delay, the rabbi scolded, "It should have been done in a week." "But rabbi" the tailor pleaded his case, "the suit I have

created is flawless. God may have finished creating the world in a week, but just look at the state it is in!"

As I write this article, I am in the midst of my eighth month as the rabbi of Temple Bat Yam. I have learned a lot about the culture and traditions of this special congregational community, and I have connected to many of you. In turn, many of you have already come to me to share the joys and challenges of your lives. However, in this limited time, there are still some members of this congregational family that I have not yet met, additionally there remain some traditions of which I am not yet familiar. It takes time to forge a new relationship with a congregation, time to learn about one another. Just as a proper fitting takes time and much effort, and sometimes stitches need to be torn out and sewn once again, so too is the

rabbinic-congregational relationship. I will however continue to strive to work toward that perfect fit. I began thinking of becoming a rabbi in my teens and now after twenty seven years, I still love it and can't imagine doing anything else.

Twenty five years ago, however, we did not have email, social media, or the internet. Today these mechanisms have made it easy to share news from around the world and also tweet, text, or share messages. Our society's focus on social media reminds me of an ancient teaching from our tradition. This teaching states that words can bring healing and comfort, but they can also cause pain and hurt. Even when we were young, we knew that the saying "sticks and stones" was false. God created the world through words and words have the power to build up or tear down. In fact, our tradition teaches that the actual words you speak are what builds the world. When you use ugly words, ugliness exists. When you use gentle words, gentleness exists. When you use compassionate words, compassion exists and so on...

There is a midrash (Viyikra Rabbah 33:1) that illustrates this concept with a story of a rabbi who sent his worker off to buy him the best cut of meat in the market. The worker came back carrying a piece of tongue. A bit later, the rabbi sent the same worker off for a second time, this time to buy the worst cut of meat in the market. And this time the worker came back once again carrying a piece of tongue. The rabbi looked at him and questioned "What is this? I sent you off to buy the best cut of meat and you came with tongue and I sent you off to buy the worst cut of meat and you also came back with tongue." The rabbi and answered "but, aren't both true?"

A tongue is both the greatest thing in the world and it is also the worst. For as the Tanach, the Jewish Bible, teaches "death and life are in the power of the tongue" (Proverbs 18:21). Every time each of us speaks, let us remember that the words we use and "what words we speak impact the world" especially today where words can easily be misinterpreted and quickly shared with so many others. What a world it

would be if we always used our words for good and to build people up. There are enough challenges in this world which tear people down. I want each of you to know that my door is always open to truly listen to your words, your emotions, and feelings, and to do my best to then use my words to bring you comfort and to build you up. I hope to not just be a rabbi, but to grow to truly be your rabbi.

These receivers will be available in the Judaica Shop before every service on a first come, first serve basis (sorry, we cannot reserve units in advance).

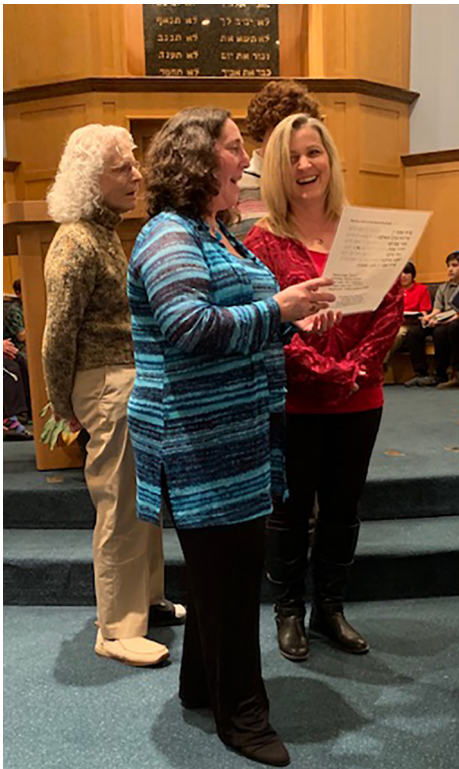
You will be asked to leave your car keys with Bette Bohlmann in the Judaica Shop in order to take out the unit. The keys will be returned to you when you
