Reflections from the Rabbi

The parallelism in our tradition is astonishing. We are just about to begin counting to 49 for the second time this year. The Jewish observance of Tisha B'Av, commemorating the destruction of the Temple and several other tragedies that befell the Jewish people, occurs on Wednesday July 29th. The coming of Tisha B'Av alerts us that there are only 7 weeks, or 49 days, until Rosh Hashanah. Seven weeks is a familiar period of time in Judaism as there are also

Rabbi David
Markus wrote
that the
parallelism
between these
two seasons of

our year "extends to the themes of the festivals, which we now recapitulate in reverse. In the spring we move from liberation (Pesach) to revelation (Shavuot). As summer reaches its mid-point, Tisha B'Av focuses us on what's buried in darkness (revelation) while Rosh Hashanah will open wide the gates of spiritual renewal (liberation). Our summer/fall journey is our spring journey in reverse".

The seven weeks from Tisha B'Av to Rosh Hashanah are also known as the Seven Weeks of Consolation. During these second forty-nine days, we are moving

from the spiritual low point of our year toward a new beginning. Or in other words, after recalling destruction and brokenness on Tisha b'Av, we begin to prepare ourselves for healing and comfort from the pain we have endured. Our tradition teaches that during the seven weeks of consolation we should begin preparing for Rosh Hashanah by asking ourselves: "What do I need to do and feel and think during these next 49 days in order to begin the new year with an open heart, ready to be transformed?"

Tisha B'Av reminds us yearly of the hurt that tearing down and destruction cause. Rather than destroying, let our words and deeds bring more goodness into the world and build others up. There are enough challenges in this world which tear people down. The seven weeks from the destruction of the Temple (Tisha B'Av) to the New Year (Rosh Hashanah) are symbolic of the seven days of creation. God created the world out of darkness and chaos. We are created in God's image and like God we also can create light and order from destruction. During this year's seven weeks of consolation, let us strive to create a new beginning for ourselves and our world. This past year, our world has been plagued by death, by sickness, by divisiveness and so much more, but out of the chaos of this year, remember the power to create the world anew is in our hands. The seven weeks from Tisha B'Av to Rosh Hashanah come every year serving as a reminder that every year brings the possibility of a new beginning. L'Shanah Tovah: May the New Year be a Good Year.

Past President's Message

Dear Temple members,

Having been your president for the last two years I can tell you one solid fact. Being president of Temple Bat Yam was more challenging but more rewarding than I thought it would be.

Two years ago, Rabbi Mills joined Temple Bat Yam. Together we faced many unpredictable challenges. In the fall of 2018 we were faced with the twin massacres of the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh and the Chabad in Poway, California. I made the difficult decision to lock our temple doors 24/7, only opening them for members and guests. In addition, we asked ABCO Security to provide an armed, experienced security guard for services, religious school and special events.

My husband, Sandy, took the reins as our Head of Security. He closely monitored any reported antisemitic crimes that occurred throughout the country. He was also tasked with securing the building. He oversaw the installation of a rudimentary camera system, locks and other security equipment which we were able to afford from generous donations.

One of my goals that I discussed with Sandy early in my presidency was to go after grants that would help to cover our rising security cost. Sandy contacted a professional grant writer to apply for a security grant from the State of Maryland. To our joy, our application was approved last November in the amount of \$41,000.00. To date, we have completed almost all of the projects. In addition, we filed another grant to improve the outside lighting of the building; we should know in October if we receive the grant.

In March 2020, the country and world was hit with Covid-19, a horrible viral pandemic. The board made several important decisions to protect our members. Rabbi Mills facilitated classes, meetings, Shabbat services, Passover, funeral services and other events via Zoom. Since the Community Seder had to be cancelled, Seder meals were prepared by Rosenfeld's Jewish Deli and delivered by temple members. So many people have joined together to support our temple and do Mitzvahs daily.

We still do not know when the building will be able to reopen its doors for services, Bar/Bat Mitzvahs, meetings, fundraisers or special events but we do know that at that time, our first concern will be for the safety and health of our members.

I worked with some incredible people while serving as your President. Without Rachel White serving as my vice-president and co-president, we would not have been able to accomplish all that we did.

I also want to thank our office manager and my friend, Peggy Tomarelli for doing a fantastic job, and

Phyllis Alpern, who stepped up as our cantorial soloist and choir director. Both of them exceeded their tasks

We watch videos, zoom presentations, and talk to others to see how other Reform temples are approaching the problems around the High Holy Days (downgraded again, now it's a problem...not too bad.)

There are wonderful, creative ideas flourishing all over the place. You know, you can't keep us Jews down! We will figure things out. After digesting many approaches, we decided to send out the Monkey Survey. We had a resounding response of 94! The responses were pretty much what I expected, a perfect bell-shaped curve for those of you who took and remember statistics. I'll summarize:

60% of the respondents said they were unlikely to come to the temple even if it were open. Being

careful. Makes sense.

All but two respondents want either fully virtual or a hybrid approach. Showing flexibility here.

Only 6 respondents wanted very different services. The rest wanted to keep much the same. Understandable.

Shorten the services or put breaks into them was universal. Got it! It's tough to sit in front of the computer too long.

Of course, melodies, rituals, community, and participation rated highly. Working on it!

So, now the group can plot out a creative approach to our High Holy Days that will hopefully fulfill the needs of all or at least most people (just being realistic). You will see new and really cool things added to our services. We are also working on keeping the beauty that we have come so accustomed to. I really hope they give you the peace we all look for at this time of the year. I can tell you there are many people putting a great deal of time into creating the atmosphere that you indicated in the survey.

And that is the positive, creative approach that I'm seeing during this pandemic. Are we beaten? No! Will we need to be flexible and open minded? Yes! But, isn't that what has gotten us this far? You bet!

TBY Membership Report, June 2020

Following a decline in membership between June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2019 our overall Temple numbers have stabilized over the past year.

- As of the end of June, the total number of Full Time and Associate members, Gift of Membership (GOM) participants, and Friends stood at 161, compared to 158 the same time last year.
- Of that total number, we had 123 full time and associate members and GOM participants, compared to 122 a year ago. Eight new members joined while seven left.
- There are 6 GOM participants: terms of 2 GOM's expired the end of June while the other 4 have terms expiring the end of August, October, November, and in March 2021, respectively.
- We had 38 Friends, compared to 36 last year at the same time. Eight new Friends joined while six left.

For those of you who see the glass half empty, you may be looking at these numbers and taking the view

that we haven't gained much this past fiscal year.

For those of you thinking in terms of the glass being half full, however, these numbers may actually indicate a success. Our membership campaigns usually benefit in the spring from the personal interactions with potential members participating in our Passover Seder, some important Havdalah programs, Shabbat Services in a Temple with open doors, and other TBY events where visitors often join in.

It is clear that our coronavirus challenges are likely to remain ahead of us. Our Temple lay leaders continue to support the Gift of Membership and Friends promotions.

This is my last newsletter report on membership. As announced at the recent Annual Meeting, Karen Abrams, who joins the Board as Immediate Past President, is taking the lead of the Temple's membership program. I will continue to take an active role in this area. I do want to thank the many of you who have actively participated in membership initiatives in recent years and look forward to working with Karen and you.

Sisterhood Report

As you know, Covid 19 has changed our landscape and has in no small way stymied our efforts to have fundraisers and fun projects. I wish I could tell you we have rescheduled events, but not yet.

If you would like to send a small contribution to Sisterhood so when we resume, we will be off to a good start.

It's also never too late to join Sisterhood for the coming year. Your membership helps our main fundraising goal to support Temple Bat Yam.

Although we have been unable to host any activities due to the pandemic during the past few months, we are planning fun activities for the time when we can all be together again. Even if you are unable to attend meetings or participate in the activities, please join and help us support our wonderful Temple.

TBY Participating in <u>Amazon Smile</u> Program – A Friendly Reminder

As noted earlier, now you, your family members, your friends, your neighbors, and your colleagues can help support Temple Bat Yam through our exciting partnership with the Amazon Smile Program.

To Account for Product returns, a portion of the quarterly donations will be withheld until the next donation cycle, subject to any restrictions due to returns from prior quarters.

Did you know that Temple Bat Yam has a unique AmazonSmile link that makes it easier for people to find and support our organization?

What does my unique link do?

When customers click on TBY's unique link, they skip the process to search for a charity to support among over 1 million eligible charities. Instead, they're taken to smile.amazon.com and are automatically asked if they want to support Temple Bat Yam.

Can I just tell supporters to search for Temple Bat Yam at smile.amazon.com?

Yes. However, that makes it harder for your supporters to find and select TBY. There are over 1 million eligible charities, and customers may end up picking a different organization during the selection process. Sharing our charity link increases the likelihood that customers will select TBY before they start shopping.

Do supporters have to click on Temple Bat Yam's AmazonSmile link every time they shop?

No. Once customers select your organization, TBY will receive 0.5% of the price of all their eligible smile.amazon.com purchases, regardless of whether they use TBY's unique AmazonSmile link to return to the site. However, we recommend that supporters bookmark and use your link so they don't accidentally shop at www.amazon.com instead of smile.amazon.com. Only purchases made at smile.amazon.com are eligible for donations.

What do customers that have already selected a charity see when they click on TBY's unique link?

If someone is already supporting TBY and they click on our unique link, they will simply be taken to smile.amazon.com so they can start shopping. They do not have to re-select your charity. If someone supporting a different charity clicks on your charity link, they are asked if they'd like to switch to support TBY.
