



## From the Rabbi's Desk

We have just completed a new month and begun a new year. This past year has been a difficult one. It has been a year where extreme hatred and barbaric brutality raised its ugly collective head in our world; something that we were all sure was a part of our past. Last November 2022, when we went to Israel, I asked



our tour guide Rafi why we were seeing fewer armed soldiers in the streets and on the buses than I recalled seeing when I was preciously in Israel. His answer was that cameras, satellites and other electronic means covered Israel's security, so it was not necessary to

have armed soldiers on the streets and buses. I am sure that once the hostilities cease, and the Knesset convenes an investigative committee, all the security breaches, failures and false assumptions will be addressed, assessed, and repaired but for now, our confidence has been shaken, our sense of security has been damaged but our hope cannot and must not ever be lost.

The month of January was so named for the Roman god of Janus. Janus is depicted as having two faces, one looking forward and the other looking backward. Looking back on the past year, we know that October 7, 2023, will go down in history, especially Jewish history, as a dark day, a day of infamy, much like Kristallnacht, December 7, 1941, September 11, 2001, and the 9<sup>th</sup> of Av. But looking forward to 2024 and beyond, we embrace the words of a poem written in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century by Naftali Herz Imber entitled *Tikvateynu* "Our Hope." Taking from the passage in

Ezekiel 37, where the dry bones come together to symbolize the exiled and despondent people of Israel who state, "*avda tikvateynu*," our hope is lost, in his poem, Imber flips their words to state the Zionist motto, "*od lo avda tikvateynu*," our hope is **not yet** lost, i.e. we still have hope!

Our world has changed since I wrote my last newsletter message. Many of us are still reeling from the shock of October 7, still trying to cope with the gruesome reality of this pogrom-like attack, this explosion of hyper-violence destroying the lives and the bodies of so many Jewish men, women, and children. Yet hope, our strongest weapon against despair, our brightest torch to fight back against the darkness, must burn bright and blaze like 1200 fully lit Hanukkah menorahs in our homes and in our hearts and illuminate our community and our world with hope. Hope for a strong and resilient Israel. Hope for enlightenment and understanding and a reduction in the ignorance and intolerance of those who see our catastrophe as an excuse for increased anti-Semitism, Judaeophobia and calls for Israel's destruction. Hope for a just and lasting settlement of Israel's right to exist as a free, democratic, and Jewish state and the self-determination of the Arabs who used to live in the territory known before 1948 as Palestine.

May we all be blessed with a New Year of happiness, joy and health. May it be a year of good fortune, success, and hopefully, a year of peace.

# President's Report

Dear Friends,

December 2023 brings many things to the minds of we Jews. So many things have been crunched into one month. It started out quiet enough for 6 days and then all hell broke loose. We got up October 7th to the news that Hamas entered Israel and killed, kidnapped, raped and tortured our fellow Jews. The world was in shock at such horrendous events. The news consisted of nothing else. What happened? Are we such a hated people?

Within a week there was an interfaith service at Temple Bat Yam. The response was so great that we had to keep adding chairs to the sanctuary. The service was beautiful with Rabbi Rutberg and three other clergy speaking. A basket was placed in the foyer on the credenza. To my surprise over \$1,200 was put into the basket to be sent to Israel. A day later \$1,500 was sent to us from the winery down the street from the Temple. They had a fundraiser for the benefit of Israel. The money was divided equally and sent to Friends of the IDF, Magen David Adom (their version of the Red Cross) and Zakat (this is the group that recovers body parts so that they may be buried whole).

Shortly after that I received a phone call from a woman that wanted to have a game day, Play for Israel, to raise funds for Israel. She wanted Temple Bat Yam to partner with her. Long story short it was a huge success raising over \$10,000 to be sent to Israel.

All three of these events were supported by our fellow Jews and Christians in the community. When the terrorist events first began, I felt very alone in the world outside of the Temple. Then the phone calls and email started. People stopped me in the street, in the market and when walking our dog. There was real sadness, concern and anger voiced by my Christian friends. My next-door neighbor made a large blue Jewish Star out of lights that still glows at night in the darkness between our two houses. Kindnesses such as these give me hope.

I went to a luncheon with about 70-80 ladies attending. On my shirt you could see my Star of David sparkling against my black shirt. One of the women stopped me to say, "You are very brave to wear that star." I looked at her and said, "This is who I am." This is who we are! We must stay strong. We will get through this. And hopefully, we will see January 2024 be the beginning of a safe, healthy, and happy New Year!!

# Membership Committee

Our overall number of Temple membership units, including our Friends, numbered 151 at the end of December 2023. The 151 total consists of 36 full-time single members; 48 full-time family members; 13 GOM, 6 associate single members; 4 associate family members; and 44 Friends.

The Gift of Membership program and the Friends membership program continue. Both have been highly successful in adding to our membership. The annual fee for the Friends program is now \$275 for those participating. The annual fee for existing Friends has remained the same. Associate Membership is no longer being offered to new congregants.

Our current Membership Committee, chaired by Doreen Linehan (Dagsboro, DE) and Vice Chair Cindy Brown (Salisbury), consists of Steve Winkler (Salisbury), Terri Broemm (Ocean Pines), Paul Schwab (West Fenwick), Shelley Klapholz (Ocean Pines), Jodi Meyers (Salisbury), and Judie Abramson (Ocean View). Other congregants are involved with membership-related matters, mostly helping by being Greeters on Friday nights.

We are happy to announce that the response to our membership committee survey was a success with a third of the total congregation participating and the results were overwhelmingly positive. We are currently working on the development of the new TBY GUIDES (Buddy System). Guidelines for anyone who would like to volunteer to be a Buddy will be forthcoming. In addition, we have joined the Chambers of Commerce in Berlin, Ocean Pines, Millsboro, and Rehoboth. We are excited to be able to spread the word in these communities about our Temple.

We ask that congregants also volunteer to serve as greeters at Shabbat services. It is important to welcome existing and potential new members coming to our services. Please contact Doreen at [timdoreen@verizon.net](mailto:timdoreen@verizon.net) if you wish to volunteer. As we look at it, all congregants are extensions of our committee. Please contact Doreen regarding a family member, friend, neighbor, office worker, etc., who would like to learn more about TBY, including our special membership promotions.

Cindy and I welcome any congregant interested in joining the membership committee. Please contact Doreen if interested. Our Greeters ARE the first faces people see coming into our Temple and we all want to make them feel welcome and comfortable joining us. We have received much positive feedback on this from people unfamiliar with Temple Bat Yam and how unique this is compared to other communities where they have attended service. Let's keep this going as we are a welcoming community.

And the Hindus hate the Muslims

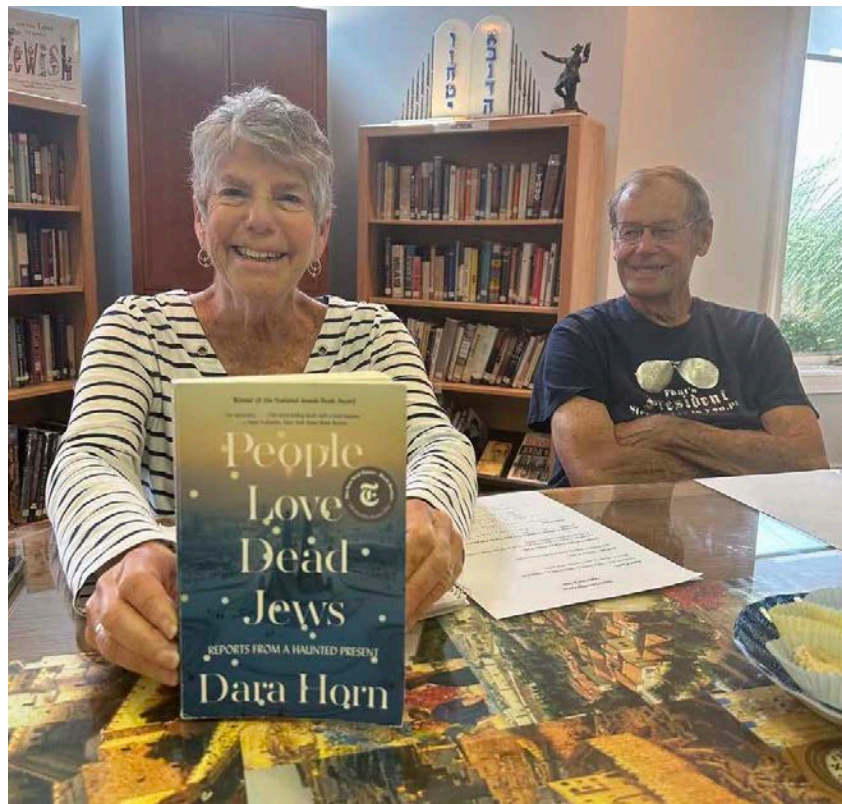
And everybody hates the Jews”

- **Gifts from Retirement Plans:** Donors of any age can make a deferred gift of an IRA or other retirement account by naming Temple Bat Yam as a beneficiary of the account at their death. Unlike individual recipients of qualified retirement plans with pre-tax contributions, such as traditional IRAs and 401(k)s, charitable organizations do not pay income tax on distributions, making this a particularly good asset to include in your planned giving.

Our Heritage Society provides an opportunity to honor and recognize donors who have chosen to support TBY through planned gifts of any size. A non-binding commitment can be easily done by completing our Statement of Intention form available on our website.

Please note that information provided by a TBY Planned Giving Committee is not intended as legal, tax, or financial advice. When considering a gift such as those listed above or others, always consult a professional advisor. 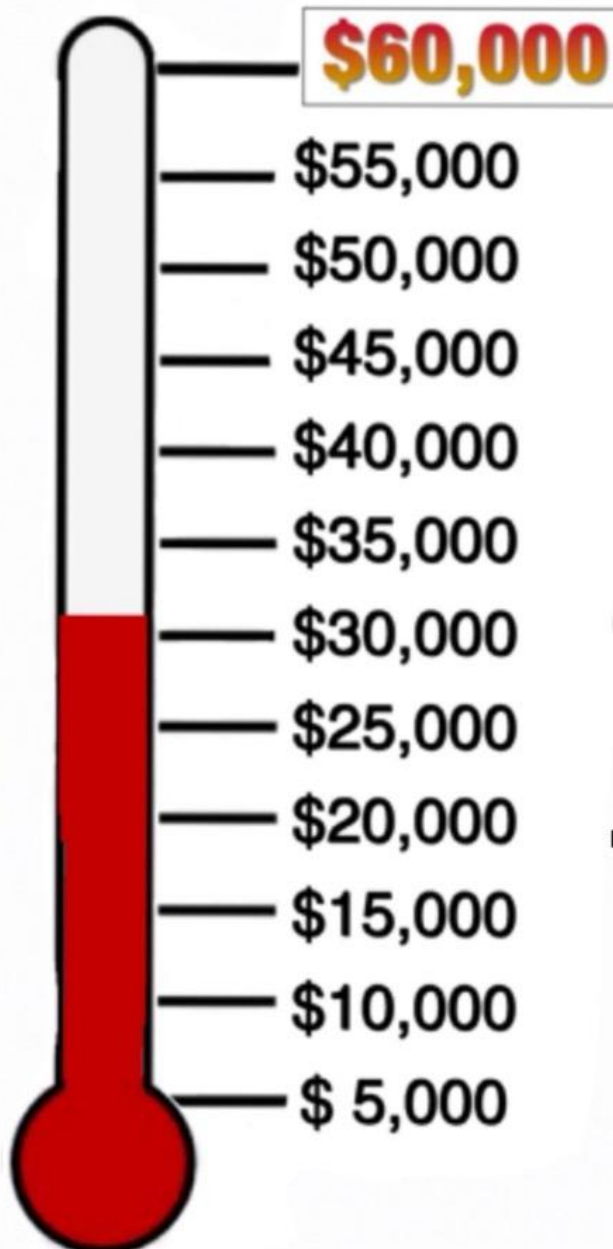
