# Bagels and Books

Temple Bat Yam includes people of all ages, and we were delighted that nonagenarian, Harvey Roth, introduced many of us to the book Marty Glickman: The Life of an American Jewish Sports Legend. We thought this book was especially appropriate since the Olympics will begin next month. Marty had been selected to participate on the USA track team in the 1936 Olympics which were held in Berlin.

Sadly, with Hitler sitting in the stadium and Avery Brundage, a known anti-semitic who headed the American Olympic Committee, Marty and Jewish teammate Sam Stoller were pulled from the race even though they were already in Berlin.

Other interesting information about Marty Glickman that was not as well known had to do with him serving as a mentor to many future athletes. For example, Marty had a lisp which made it more challenging for him to become a New York sports broadcaster. Recently, when famous basketball player Bill Walton died, a newspaper article stated that Bill, who also had a speech impediment, credited Marty with helping him so that he, too, could become a sportscaster in his retirement.

was invited to light the torch at the 14<sup>th</sup> European Maccabi Games which were held in 2015 in Berlin created a special feeling of satisfaction. Even more so, "Clutching the red-white-and-blue striped singlet of her dad's 1936 uniform, she waved it at the box where Hitler presided over the Games. 'We're here, Dad!' she called, echoing Mr. Glickman's own shout of triumph in 1985, when he returned to the Olympic Stadium and yelled at the Nazi leader's ghost, 'I am still here, and you are not.'"

Thanks, Harvey, for interweaving the commonalities of your life with Marty Glickman's, such as life in the Bronx and the effect of Jewish quotas by colleges/universities. Learning that Glickman's daughter

## Library Report

We told Sean that we would like to give him an honorarium and his response was that we should decide what amount of money his guidance was worth and use the money we would have paid him to purchase what we need for our TBV Library!

As a result of our work with Sean we will:

- Refine our cataloguing process
- Develop a survey to measure the interest and use of the library by congregants
- Create attractive and functional displays for children's materials
- Purchase new books to update our collection



**Jewish Book Sales** - we created more space on the shelves by removing duplicate copies of books and selling them at two book sales that were held in September 2023 and June 2024. A combined total of over \$250 was raised to supplement our 2024-2025 budget.

We also sponsored our **Bagels & Books** programs which were all well-attended.

- January 7, 2024 The Plot Against America led by **Bob Strauss**

## Caring Committee

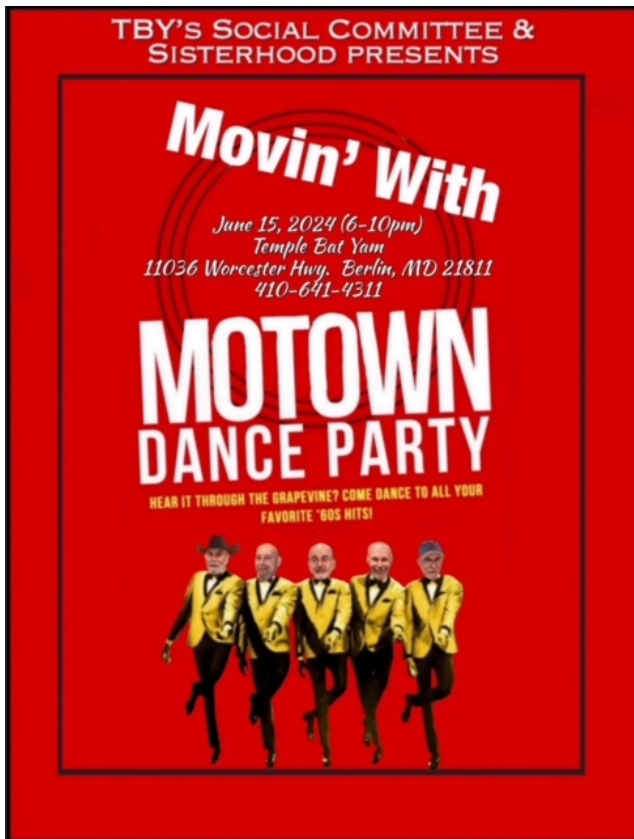
We were very saddened at the loss of our member, Steve Winkler. We are so sad to have lost another long-term temple member, Carol Schachter.

# Membership Committee
