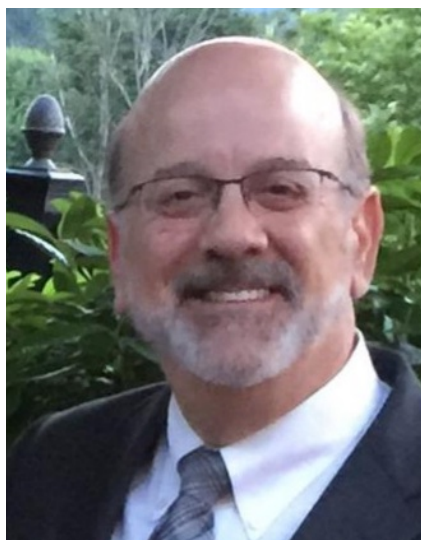




From the Rabbi's Desk

In late August or around the time of Purim, I often tell the story about a small Torah in my previous Temple in Brownsville, Texas. It was one of those Holocaust Torahs from Czechoslovakia saved from destruction by the Nazis and found many years after the war in



Prague. The children's book *The Tattooed Torah* tells the story. The British based organization that takes care of these Torah scrolls gave one on permanent loan to the small congregation of Temple Beth El in Brownsville, Texas, the southernmost town in the contiguous United States, in 1980.

When I began to serve there as a rabbi in 1985, Sara and I noticed that the little Torah scroll was not in great shape. The little scroll was rarely used for Shabbat or holiday Torah readings because most of the writing was faded, making it very hard to read. It seemed a shame not to use it but fixing it and basically rewriting it would have been prohibitively expensive and might have been contrary to the rules of the loan.

But the important thing to note is that in one small section of the Torah, in a paragraph containing 3 verses, the writing was big, bold and bright, very easy to see and read. That section was the Maftir of the Torah portion *Ki Teitsei*, Deuteronomy 25:17-19, which we read a couple of weeks ago. There it is written, "Zachor et asher asah l'cha Amalek!"

Remember what Amalek did to you! We first learn about Amalek in Exodus chapter 17. Amalek was a

nomadic nation in the desert that chose to attack the Israelites as they entered Sinai having just escaped Egyptian bondage. Many other nations and groups will fight with us as we make our way through the wilderness towards the Promised Land but Amalek stands out as unique and the most evil enemy we encountered in our journey. Why? Because they attacked us from the rear; they attacked us where we were the weakest. They attacked innocent and defenseless women and children, the elderly and the infirm. Their brutal attack was waged in a most malicious and cowardly fashion at the back rather than at the front of the camp where the armed men, the soldiers, were prepared to defend the community. Their evil action was carried out in the same pusillanimous barbaric manner as attacks by Hamas, Hezbollah, Black September, Nazis, Crusaders, Cossacks and so many others. Amalek now stands as a metaphor, a code word, an infamous example of anti-Semitic and anti-Jewish attacks, massacres and pogroms.

Bagels and Books

Traditionally, we begin the new year with Rosh Hashanah, but with Bagels & Books we began the new year on Sunday, September 29th with our esteemed Rabbi Rutberg leading our discussion for which we are most appreciative. This year we selected The Sunflower by Simon Wiesenthal because its main theme is forgiveness, which is certainly appropriate as we approach Yom Kippur.

The story revolves around the author who was a teenager in a concentration camp near Lviv. He was working outside a hospital when he was called in because a Nazi soldier was dying and wanted forgiveness from a Jew for what he had done. The central question Wiesenthal asked himself, as did those of us participating in the discussion, was, "Who has the right to forgive, and should we forgive the soldier?" The second half of the book includes essays by religious leaders of many faiths, other Holocaust survivors, and even Nazi leaders who explore the moral ethics of this question.



After discussing the significance of the book title and the symbolic meanings of a sunflower, our group highlighted some common phrases we have all heard, and discussed how they might apply to The Sunflower.

- To err is human, to forgive is divine
- Turn the other cheek
- Forgiving vs Forgetting

We truly enjoyed this Bagels & Books discussion. Everyone contributed to the discussion in some way, and we listened to each other with compassion and respect.

Membership Report

Our overall number of Temple membership units are numbered at 158 (up 4 from last quarter) at the end of September, 2024. The 158 total consists of 12 GOMs; 110 full-time single and family members; and 36 Friends & Associates.

The Gift of Membership program and the Friends membership program continue. Both have been highly successful in adding to our membership. The annual fee for the Friends program is now \$290 for those participating. Associate Membership is no longer being offered to new congregants.

Our current Membership Committee is now co-chaired by Doreen Linehan (Dagsboro, DE) and Cindy Brown (Salisbury). Other congregants are involved with membership-related matters, mostly helping by being Greeters on Friday nights and Chamber of Commerce events.

The Membership Committee is in partnership with the Chambers of Commerce in Berlin, Ocean Pines, Millsboro, and Rehoboth. We are excited to be able to spread the word in these communities about our Temple.

And therefore this Torah scroll, saved from destruction in the Holocaust, screams out from the parchment, "REMEMBER!," always remember and never forget what has happened and what continues to happen to us.

Now, as we come upon the one-year anniversary of that horrific massacre, the most severe and destructive pogrom since the Holocaust, waged against our people who were simply singing and dancing on the sands of the desert, living peacefully in their homes among their family and friends, we will remember. And we will not forget!

It is interesting to note that our holiday worship services that focus on the memorial for those of our people, family and friends are known as Yizkor; the name taken from the main prayer in that service. But what is truly curious is that the Yizkor prayer is addressed to God. Yizkor means, "He (God) will remember." At this year's Yizkor services on Yom Kippur and especially on Shemini Atseret-Simhat Torah, the anniversary of the massacre in Israel on the Hebrew calendar, we should change the opening of the prayer or change the name of the service to "Nizkor! We will Remember!" As the poet and Holocaust survivor Avraham Shlonsky wrote, (it is as if we have taken) "An oath. To remember, not once to forget!"

Sara and I wish to all our friends, the whole Bat Yam family, a Shanah Tovah! ... a very good and blessed New Year filled with Health, Hope and Happiness!
