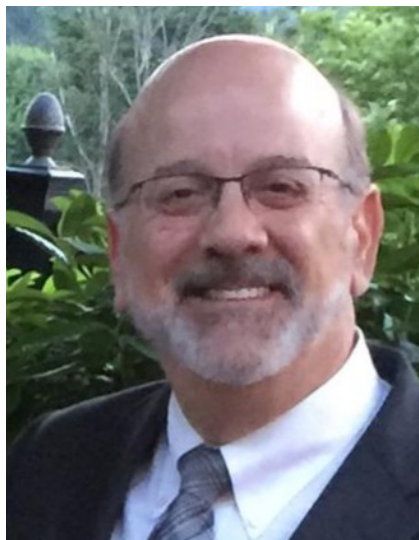




From the Rabbi's Desk

Happy New Year! In the immortal and eloquent words of the late great Yogi Berra, "it's like déjà vu all over again." On February 2nd, we will celebrate the strange holiday of Groundhog Day. It is based on the Christian festival of Candlemas associated with Mary's 40 days



of impurity following Jesus' birth (see Leviticus 12) and related to the European *bubbemeiseh* that clear weather on Candlemas forebodes a longer winter. Over time, the legend/myth morphed into using the shadow of an animal to predict the duration of winter. The people of central Europe,

mostly German speaking, used the badger as their forecasting animal. In Hungary, they primarily used the bear with the badger serving as backup if the bears were not around (especially during football season). But it is the Pennsylvania Dutch (Deutsch-German) people who transmogrified the Candlemas Bear/Badger legend into what we now know as Groundhog Day and the weather forecasting animal into an eternal semi-mythical groundhog named Phil who resides in a hole in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania between Harrisburg and Pittsburgh.

Although the American tradition of Groundhog Day in Pennsylvania Dutch Country began in the 19th century, our contemporary 21st century American society relates the day more to a 1993 fantasy rom-com film starring Bill Murray and Andie MacDowell than to any European Christian legend. In case you never saw the film, Bill Murray plays an obnoxious and cynical

weatherman who goes to Punxsutawney to cover the yearly "emergence" of the groundhog named Phil on Groundhog Day and finds himself in a time loop reliving the same day over and over again. Andie MacDowell plays the part of his new TV producer and his burgeoning love interest. Although for everybody else it is a new day, for Bill Murray, it is always the same day; monotonous, repetitive, unpleasant, predictable and very boring. Déjà vu all over again day after day after day.

The point of the story is that Bill Murray can only break out of this never-ending time loop by changing his character, his behavior, and becoming a better person. Now that we are in the winter months, things tend to slow down here at Temple Bat Yam. We find ourselves in a predictable pattern of events and programs, classes and services. Typically, we do not break out of this pattern until after Passover when the warmer weather begins. This year, I hope that things will be different.

This year, my plan is to shake things up a little; to try new things no matter if the winter is long or short, no matter if Phil sees his shadow or not. I am only forecasting right now but we should expect to see some new things on the horizon. Let's get ready for some bright new ideas shining through our typical winter dreariness. Hopefully, they will be successful and establish some new traditions and practices for our Temple even in the dark and dull days of winter.

May we soon see the dawning of a bright new day filled with fun activities, classes, events, and programs and not simply a repetition of the same old, same old, days and ways of winter.

Bagels and Books

First-time discussion leader, Terri Broemm, made excellent use of her teaching skills for this session's book, The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store by James McBride. By providing background information about the author and focusing on themes and the interactions of characters, Terri set the stage for a good discussion. She even made sure that everyone had an opportunity to participate by using tried and true classroom management techniques!

Terri provided personal information about the author's parents who were an interfaith and interracial couple. His mother was an Orthodox Jew and his father, an African American Baptist pastor. He grew up in public housing in Brooklyn and experienced what it was like to be poor financially, but rich musically. In fact, he majored in Musical Composition as an undergraduate at Oberlin and Journalism at the graduate level at Columbia. Identity, religion and community social change are key themes in McBride's works.



Participants added to the discussion using examples from their own lives. For example, Jane Rosenthal mentioned the name of a neighbor in Ocean Pines who lived in Chicken Hill, the setting for this book, which is near Pottstown, PA. Tim Linehan asked about one of the characters who was referred to as Son

of Man, a truly evil person in the book. He explained that in the Catholic religion, Jesus used Son of Man to refer to himself, often signifying his shared humanity with others while also alluding to his role as the future Messiah. Tim's question generated discussion about why the author would use this name for an evil character.



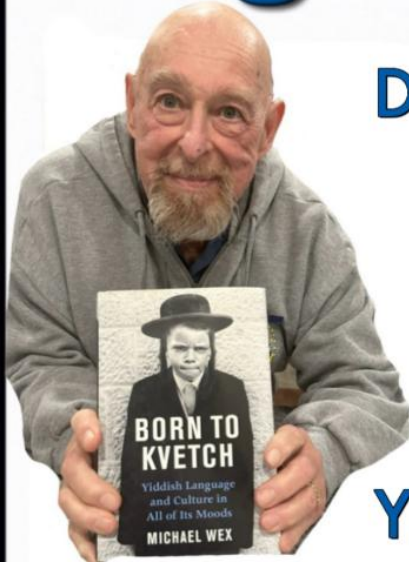
Terri suggested that, if we'd like to have more of an understanding of The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store, especially as related to the many characters and
